


Income for the BDRA in 2022 came from a variety of sources. By far the biggest was the sponsorship from VirginMediao2 for the event at Milton Keynes Football Club early in the year. Income was also received from competition entry fees, membership fees and the sale of equipment bought by or given to the Association.

Whilst the MKFC even generated the most income it was also the most expensive. This was due to the cost of equipment required to run the event and compensating pilots to take part.

Both the Cosford and Blades over Buckminster events were approximately cost neutral with the income being spent on running the events. The Weston Park and Champs encountered significant losses due to the £3,000 ground rent for the former and the payment of winners prize money for the later.

During the year the BDRA invested in HDZero equipment and had nominal running costs which included IT, postage, merchandise and banking costs.

All the BDRA events had live streaming and several had Matt Andrews providing professional commentary.

At the beginning of 2022 the BDRA had £2,073. After a profit of £360 the year closed with £2,433. This money is held in accounts with Santander, Lloyds and PayPal.

It is noted that without the o2 sponsorship the BDRA would have operated at a significant loss for the year.
